Jersey Shore Area School District Capital Projects Committee Meeting Minutes of September 18, 2017

A. Call to Order: Merrill Sweitzer, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

B. Courtesy of the Floor

Mary Thomas – Commented on amount change of the fiber project and the funding needs of the project listing.

Burt Francis – Commented on prioritizing the project listing.

C. Updated Project List

Ben Enders reviewed the attached updated capital project listing, highlighted the completed projects, & noted the items that have been removed. The removed items will be kept in a separate list maintained by the administration.

There was discussion on removing the Middle School lockers from the listing as this is a cosmetic expense and is not necessary for the day-to-day operations. Mark Wall noted that the project includes both the painting the outside of the lockers and installing combination locks. This will prevent any continuing damage of the lockers.

There was discussion on the resurfacing of the track that is listed. Mark Wall informed the committee that track was installed in 2001 and was resprayed in 2010. Mark Wall stated that he met with two vendors at the track and it was determined that the track was due for another respray application before it begins peeling up. Mark also corrected that the warranty for the respray is two years and not fifteen years that the vendor previously told him. This respray will also include the restriping and painting of the track.

Chris Fravel inquired on why the tennis courts were not included on the capital project listing. The condition of the tennis courts was discussed with the high school courts needing resealed and painted and the middle school courts needing more repairs (ie. cracks sealed, drainage repairs, etc). There was further discussion on the need to have a facility that is in closure proximity to more efficiently conduct varsity tennis matches. The administration will review potential options for the tennis courts and report back to the capital projects committee.

The committee asked that the classroom security upgrades at Avis elementary be added to the capital project list.

Ben Enders reviewed that the administration would like to proceed with the following five projects: Fiber Backbone project, Administration Roof Top Unit, Middle School Exterior Lighting, Rear Metal Roof of the Administration Building, and the Main Office Door upgrades at Avis Elementary. The next step in the process is to place the projects before the board for approval. Dr. Jill Wenrich expressed a desire that was agreed by the committee to place the Avis Office Door upgrade on the September 25, 2017 board agenda.

Ben Enders reviewed the results of the Fiber Backbone Replacement Project rebid. There were two bids received: Celerity Integrated Services, Inc., Quakertown, PA, \$45,175 and Williamsport Electric, Inc., Montgomery, PA, \$57,824. It was noted that these were the same and only two companies that originally bid on the project. The bids were reviewed by administration and the district's solicitor and found to be acceptable. The committee agreed to move the project forward for board approval on September 25, 2017.

D. Adjournment: Merrill Sweitzer, Chairman, adjourned the meeting at 7:30 pm.
