Attendance Plan for Academy of Integrated Studies

All students enrolled in all Academy programs receive the following supports:

- 1. Monitoring Attendance is closely monitored for all students at the Academy by homeroom teacher and social workers.
- Weekly Reporting Attendance for all students at the academy programs will be sent to
 districts on a weekly basis. District is responsible for Identifying a District Attendance
 POC* to receive weekly attendance reports and communicate to district staff as needed.
- 3. Daily Reporting For districts using DaRTS, attendance is entered on a daily basis. District staff are able to access their students to check attendance.

The following additional supports only apply to those students enrolled in the Academy's Partial Hospitalization Program:

- Letter During intake, all students receive a letter explaining the importance of attendance and explaining the process of reassessment of placement for chronic absenteeism
- 5. Partial Hospitalization Program Checklist During intake, Social Work reviews this checklist with parent/guardian and informs them that their cooperation in assuring daily attendance to the program is essential. Parent/Guardian and client sign the checklist.
- 6. Every Absence Each time the student is absent, Social Worker calls the family to Inquire as to why student is absent.
- 7. Unexcused Absences When student has three unexcused absences, Social Worker contacts Attendance POC to request that a written notification be sent to the family indicating that the student has been truant. At this time, the district may request to convene an Attendance Improvement Conference (Pursuant to PA Truancy Guidelines) in which a representative from the Academy would attend and serve as part of the district's team to develop an attendance plan for the student.

After three unexcused absences, the Social Worker will continue to inform the district Attendance POC of each unexcused absence and district may request to participate in an Attendance Improvement Conference at any time.

- 8. Excused Absences When a student has three excused absences during a twenty-day review period, the Social Worker will call the district attendance POC.
- 9. Twenty-Day Review Period If attendance (excused or unexcused) becomes habitual, the Social Worker contacts family, the LEA Student Point of Contact*, and any community agencies to inform them of the absences and invite them to the Academy for the Twenty-day Treatment Review Meeting. At this meeting, if the team feels there is a pattern, an attendance improvement plan will be developed for the student as part of the student's treatment plan. As part of this plan, the student and family will be reinformed of the importance of attendance for treatment and therapy. If the district chooses to participate in the Twenty-day Review Meeting, they have input into the team meeting and can collaborate with other team members to develop treatment plans that could include attendance goals and strategies to improve attendance.

As part of the Twenty-Day Review Meeting, the district may opt to include an Attendance Improvement Conference as part of the meeting. The LEA Student Point of Contact* is required to participate and fulfill all truancy related guidelines set forth by the PA Truancy Guidelines.

For students who continue to be chronically absent, the treatment review team will determine if the additional modifications may be appropriate or if the student should be considered for discharge. Per the Partial Hospitalization Program Checklist, "The decision to discharge should be made as a collaborative effort which would include the treatment team, client, parent(s)/guardian, consulting psychologists, school district personnel and any additional service providers or individuals involved with the client."

^{*}District Attendance Point of Contact — This person serves receives attendance reports and is responsible for communicating to any necessary information to the students family and relevant district staff.

^{*}LEA Student Point of Contact - This person is responsible for participating in necessary meetings and contributing to the decision making process of a student's treatment and program. For regular education students, the building principal is typically considered the LEA. Student Point of Contact. For special education students, the special education supervisor is considered the LEA Student Point of Contact.
