B. Discussion Items

1. Extended Cost Cutting Measures:

- 13. Remove <u>ALL</u> Sports Programs or pay to play for all sports (including music, musicals, instrumental lessons, etc.) with scholarships to supplement students who cannot find funding.
- 14. Eliminate ALL iPads and all associated costs (eBackpack, apps, infrastructure, tech time, etc.)
- 15. Administrative ACT 93 15 % Salary Cut
- 16. Eliminate Source 4 Teachers (return responsibility to administrator/head teacher/secretary) Utilize substitutes more effectively (sometimes there is a surplus, sometimes lack of)
- 17. Eliminate Atomic Learning
- 18. Aggressively campaign to bring back students from cyber/charter schools
- 19. Eliminate Assistant Superintendent position
- 20. Eliminate Avis/Salladasburg Principal Position (use head teacher/secretary)
- 21. Combine Jersey Shore Elementary Principal and Middle School Assistant Principal into one (1) position.
- 22. All principals to 10 month positions
- 23. Eliminate print center (teachers make their own copies)
- 24. Eliminate Central Supply and return supplies to each building
- 25. Stop hiring teachers at top of scale.
- 26. Reduce the sport schedule and distance traveled to events
- 27. Bulk purchasing with other districts
- 28. Reduce ALiCE training cycle

- 29. Reduce conference attendance by staff
- 30. Form community group and inter district teams to brainstorm solutions; make the money saving ideas into a contest to get the most involved
- 31. Partner with other districts to lobby for changes to cyber/charter regulations
- 32. Eliminate mileage reimbursement and cell phones for administration
- 33. Seek corporate, private and alumni donors
- 34. Sell advertising
