Work-Based Learning (WBL) Programs

Cooperative Education - 7 students

Co-Op is a capstone WBL experience for CTE seniors placed at worksites directly related to Jersey Shore's CTE programs. Students continue technical training in the field amongst professionals and colleagues while getting paid to learn their craft. Thank you to Main Street Auto Repair, Blaise Alexander Nissan, Pine Mountain Auto Repair, Sweitzer's Garage, and Paulhamus Diesel Performance for hosting Automotive Technology students. We would also like to thank Way to Grow Learning & Development Center - Childcare and Bald Birds Brewing Company - Maintenance & Repair for providing co-op placements this year.

Diversified Occupations - 4 students

This senior-year WBL CTE program places students at worksites training in occupations for which Jersey Shore does not currently have a CTE program. Thank you to Geisinger Jersey Shore - Respiratory Therapy, UPMC Lock Haven -Women's Health, River Valley YMCA - Sports Management, and Rockey Auctions - Supply Chain Logistics for hosting student placements for 2024-2025.

CTE Internship Experience - 1 student

Grade 11-12 students can take advantage of part-time internships via the CTE experience program. Currently the JSASD Business Office is hosting an accounting intern. In past years, the JSASD Technology Department also hosted networking and IT interns as part of this WBL program.

Grant Funding for CTE

Federal Perkins Grant Update

JSASD receives approximately \$36,000 annually to support salary & benefits for our CTE Paraprofessional Mrs. Lisa Tibbens, purchase SkillsUSA memberships for all CTE students, provide industry-recognized credentials/certifications, send instructors to professional development conferences, and purchase equipment. JSASD completed a Perkins Compliance Review in January 2025 and received only one corrective action related to continuous stakeholder

communication.

Thanks to the 2024–2025 federal Perkins grant, all Jersey Shore CTE students complete approved safety training and earn OSHA 10-Hour General or Industry-Specific certification. This credential is valid for life, but refresher training is recommended every 3-5 years as part of regular on-the-job safety training requirements.

Precision Machining Field Trip

Fifteen students in the precision machining CTE program visited the Central PA Institute of Science & Technology in Pleasant Gap and First Quality in Lock Haven to learn about education, training, and career opportunities in manufacturing & engineering fields.





Health & Medical Assisting Field Trip

Seventeen students in Health & Medical Assisting CTE visited Geisinger Jersey Shore on January 24. Students toured the facility and previewed career opportunities in Emergency Medicine, Respiratory Therapy, Physical Therapy, General Surgery, Skilled Senior Care, Pediatrics, and Orthopedics. Geisinger has supported the development of the new Health & Medical Assisting CTE program with professionals serving as Occupational Advisory Committee members as well as donating equipment, providing guest speakers/presenters, and hosting field trips.

Mrs. Lisa Tibbens is the CTE paraprofessional and Perkins instructional assistant at Jersey Shore. She provides instructional support primarily within the childcare and culinary arts CTE programs. This staff position is funded by 60% federal Perkins dollars and 40% local funds. Mrs. Tibbens has been working in Jersey Shore for 8 years.

NOCTI Exams - April 7-16, 2025


The end-of-program assessment for CTE programs is the National Occupational Competency Testing Institute (NOCTI) exams which will be administered April 7-16. Evaluators are needed to ensure compliance with safety guidelines and protocol, monitor test time, maintain a presence in the testing area, evaluate student work, and document any irregularities. Instructors will be reaching out to OAC members to secure evaluators within the next few weeks.

Biennial Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment - CLNA - Summer 2025

The purpose of the CLNA is to support data-driven decision making and more closely align planning, spending, and accountability activities under Perkins V to focus CTE initiatives at the local level. As required, JSCTE will host/conduct its CLNA Consortium Meeting this summer in collaboration with LycoCTC, SUN Tech, Williamsport CTE, and Keystone Central CTC. More information is forthcoming.
